



## What is a typical meeting of an IMPACT Group like?

IMPACT Groups are required to meet together formally at least once/week.

The following provides an outline of a typical meeting.

### *Ice-breaker:*

- To break down guarded relational walls
- To help members to “un-pack” and begin to focus.
- Re-introduce the theme or topic of the meeting.

### *Word of God:*

- This time is designed to hear what God is teaching us as a whole Prairie community, to work toward biblical applications of that teaching, and then to develop appropriate accountability for obedience in responding to God.
- Discussion will focus on the biblical theme that has been presented in Community Chapel sermon.
- Particular emphasis will be given to the application issues of “How does the Word speak into our lives and call us to obedience? So what? How will we live differently this week because of the Word of God?”

### *One Another:*

- One-to-one accountability with partners regarding growth goals.
- Activities/exercises to practice the “one-another’s” of Scripture (e.g. encourage/appreciate one another, share with one another).

### *Prayer:*

- Journal of prayer requests (Each Leader will maintain a journal of prayer for his/her group.) This will help you to identify where God has answered prayer and help the group see God working.
- Pray for each other –The main concern is “How can we pray for one another?” Pray for these requests throughout the week as you personally pray for your IMPACT group.

### *Worship:*

- Vertical relationship worship.
