Prospectus for 1923-1924 Second Year Three Hills Bible School

The need of a Bible Training School for this district was laid upon the hearts of a few of God's children in the year 1921. Consequently, in the fall of 1922, after much waiting upon God, the Bible School was opened in the School Bldg., one mile north of Three Hills. The School stands for every whit of the "Fundamentals"; it is of an interdenominational spirit and character, and has as its motto: "To know Christ and make Him known." Believing that God will supply all the needs for His own work, the school is established upon a faith basis throughout.

The school year consists of two three month terms concluding about April 15, 1924.

Method of Bible Study:

The whole Bible is studied consecutively and constructively under the guidance of select questions given to each student. This method enables each student to produce his own original findings from the Scriptures and thereby secure the Book as his own possession - his very own. This is the culminating object of the School.

Bible Courses: By Mr. L. E. Maxwell

The Bible Study consists of two courses of two years and three years length, respectively.

The two year **Primary** Course covers consecutively the entire Bible omitting only the Psalms, Synoptic.

Gospels and Hebrews, all of which will later be incorporated under a separate course.

This study covers three hours weekly.

The three year **Advanced** Course covers the whole Bible, Historically, Prophetically and Doctrinally. This course embraces practical discipline in many subjects – usually treated separately, and includes origins, expository and theme writing on completed portions of the Scriptures. The class is open to all who have completed the primary course and to those new students who are already sufficiently enlightened in the Bible to warrant their omission of the Primary Course. Two hours weekly.

History: By L. E. Maxwell

"Ancient History in Bible Light" is a most enlightening study. This may be termed: "History in the Light of Prophecy." Two hours weekly.

Bible Atlas: By Mr. J. F. Kirk

Hurlburt's "Bible Atlas" is a study of the geography in the Old and New Testament Worlds, including the journeys of the Apostle Paul. One hour.

Personal Work: By Mr. Hector Kirk

Torrey's Personal Work is the Text Book used. One hour weekly.

<u>Literature</u>: By Mrs. Mabel Martinell, a teacher who has surrendered her lucrative position to take the Bible Course and give her services to the other Bible Students. Speaking English and good Composition are emphasized. Two hours weekly.

Missions: By Mr. Hector Kirk

Mr. Kirk brings us practical experiences from his recent experiences in the Sudan Interior where he has been laboring for the past five years. After the first of the year we expect a Mr. Hamilton, a missionary of thirty years experience in India under the C.M.A. to give us valuable assistance.

Practical Work: Mr. Edward Kirk, Field Director

The outstanding feature of this branch is the evangelistic effort being put forth by the faculty and student body to care for at least eight untouched school districts each Lord's day. This proves a great success.

Rates: No tuition is charged.

Until a Boarding School obtains facilities, all incoming students will be accommodated by the several interested families in the community at the monthly rate of fifty dollars per month. Students should bring bedding.
