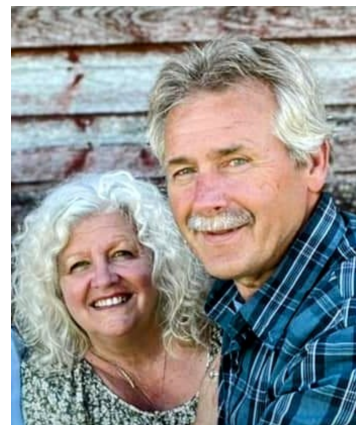


Kelm, Katie Lu (**Sinclair**, BC '95-'97) and her husband Dustin have been missionaries with
